PRAGUE

- Also known as The Golden City

CURRENCY

- The Czech Crown (CZK) is the official currency of the Czech Republic. Although credit and debit cards are commonly used, it's still a good idea to have some cash for smaller businesses.

WEATHER



- There are four different seasons in the Czech Republic. Summers are warm and relaxing. Typically, fall and spring are either cool or warm and rainy. Winters are usually cold with temperatures often below zero.

TRANSPORTATION

- The public transport system in the Czech Republic, consisting of trams, trains, buses, and the Prague Metro, is excellent. The most effective way to see the nation is certainly via train.
